

What Is a Prefix?

A prefix is a group of letters at the beginning of a word that changes the word's meaning.

Word	Prefix and Meaning	New Word
view	<i>pre-</i> meaning "before"	preview
happy	<i>un-</i> meaning "not"	unhappy
