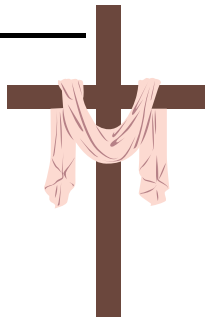

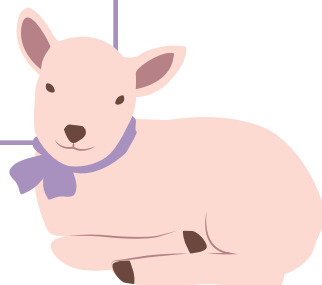

Easter is a special holiday that is celebrated by Christians all around the world. It is a time to remember and celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ.



According to the Bible, Jesus was crucified on a Friday, which is now known as Good Friday. Three days later, on a Sunday, Jesus rose from the dead. This event is known as the resurrection, and it is one of the most important events in the Christian faith.



Christians know that Jesus died to save us from our sins. This means that he took the punishment for all the bad things we have done so that we wouldn't have to be punished ourselves.

The historical accounts of Jesus' death and resurrection are primarily recorded in the New Testament of the Bible. However, several non-Christian historical texts from the ancient world also reference Jesus' death. For example, the Roman historian Tacitus wrote about the crucifixion of Jesus and the persecution of Christians in the early years of the Roman Empire. The Jewish historian Flavius Josephus also mentions Jesus in his writings.

Easter is typically celebrated between March 22nd and April 25th. The exact date changes each year because it is determined by the lunar calendar and the spring equinox.

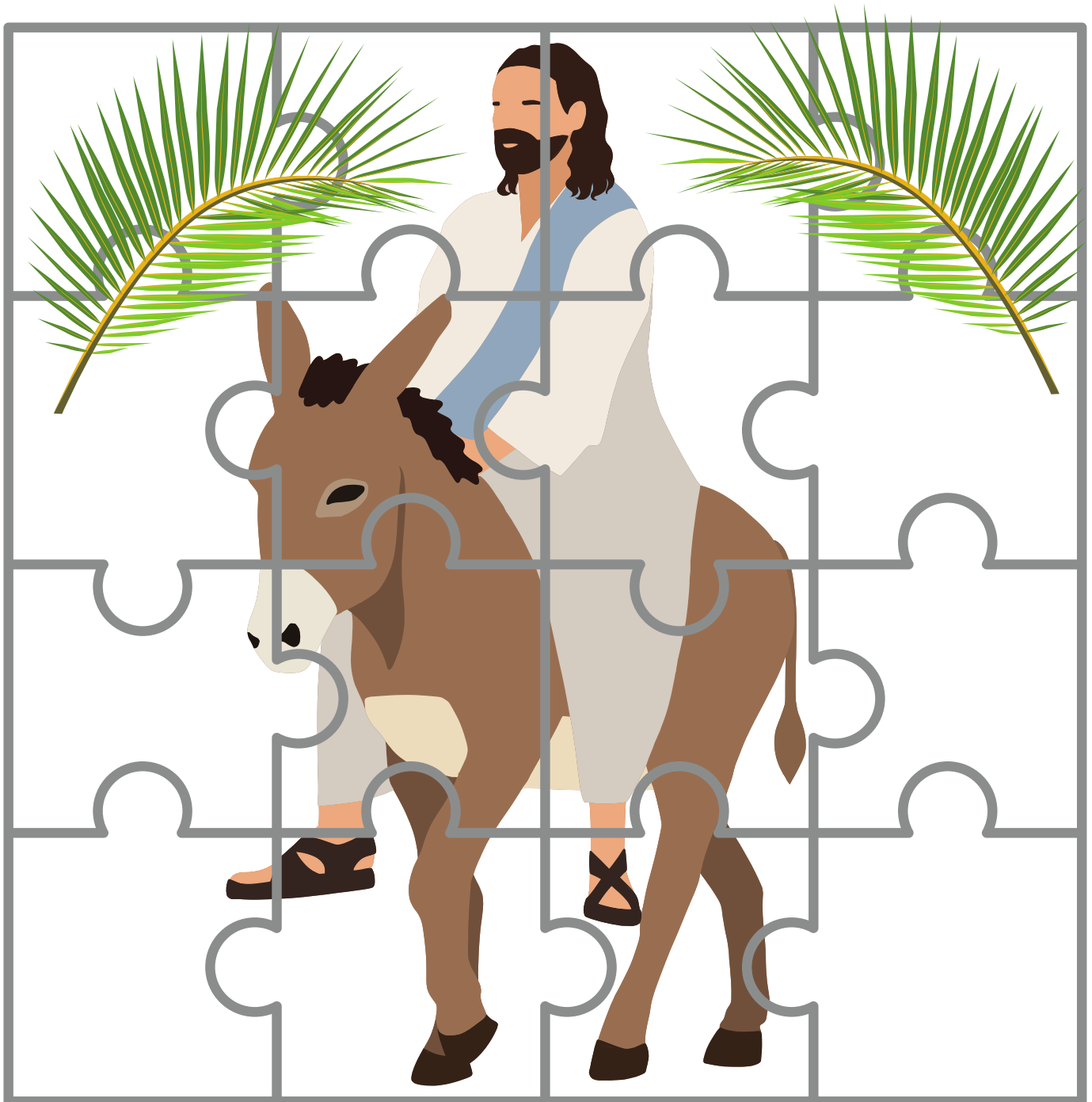

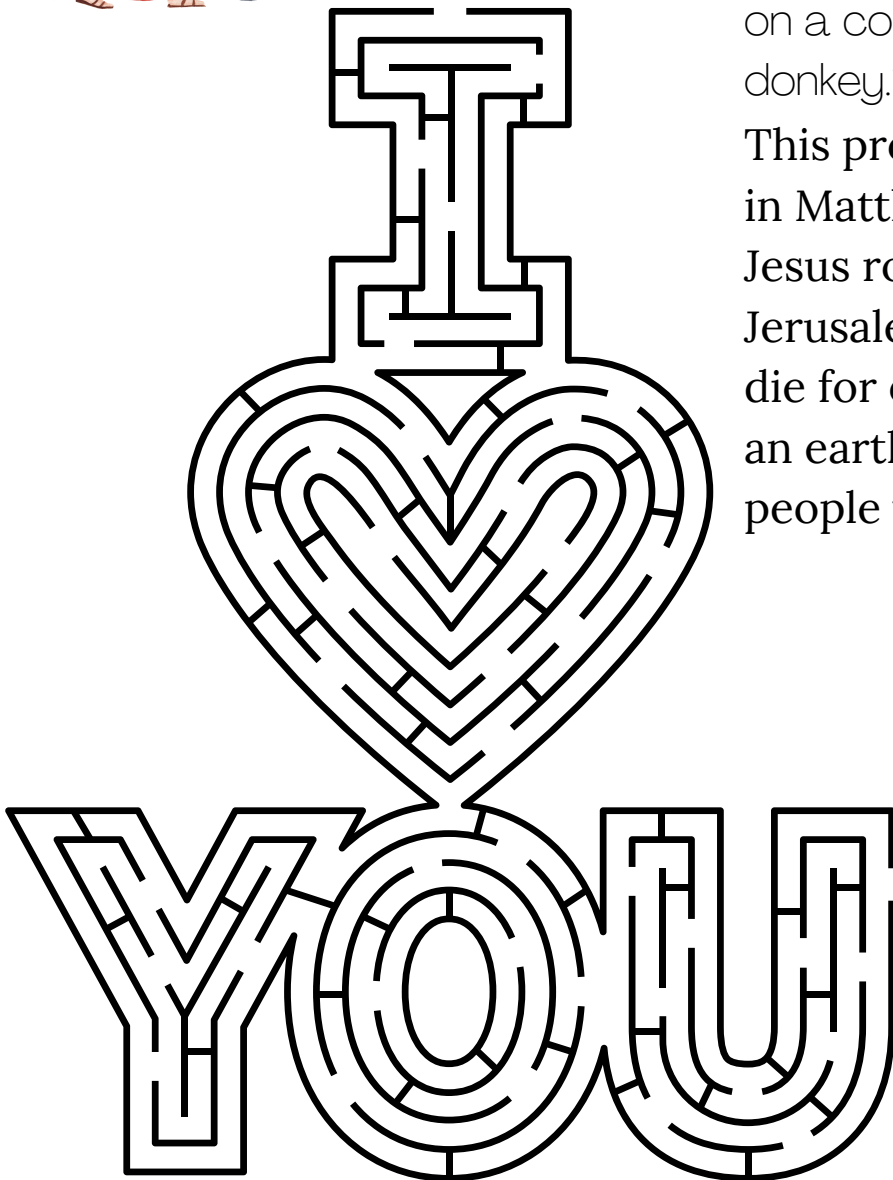

and he left the same way.



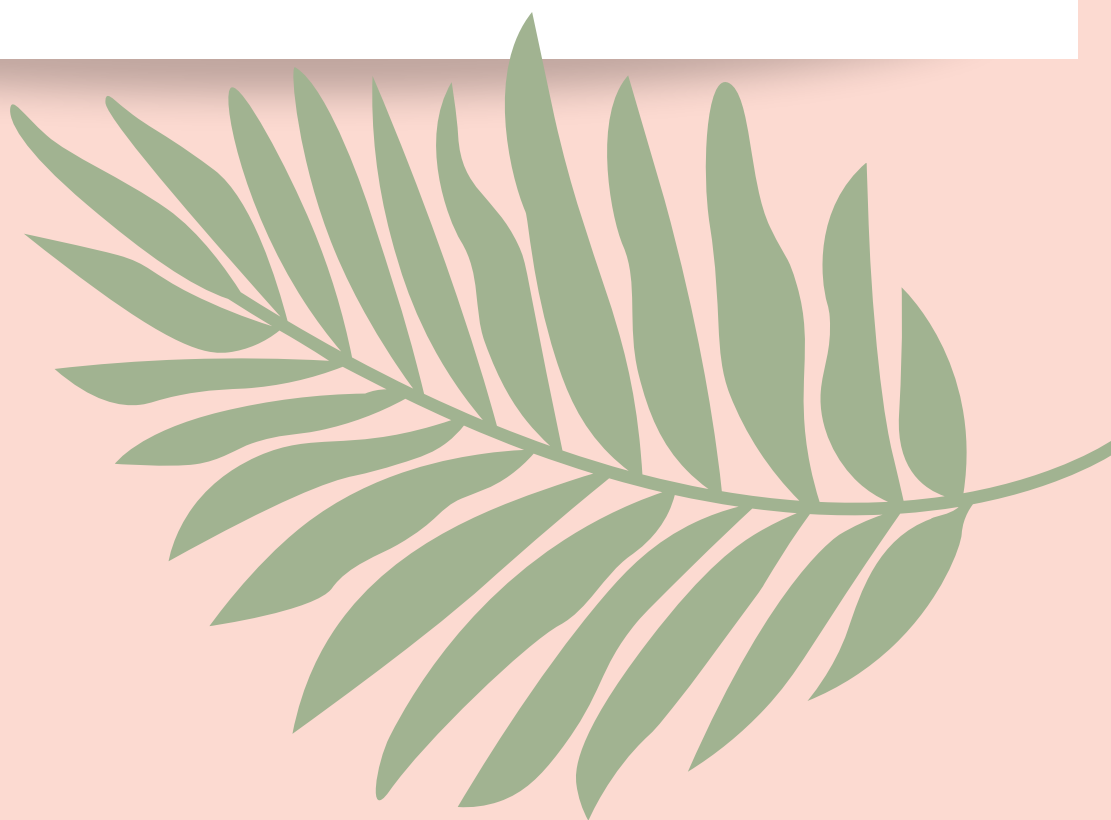
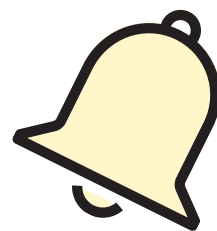
Zechariah 9:9 prophesied the coming of a king “righteous and victorious, lowly and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey.”
