





Requirements of Citizenship - Oath of Allegiance





- 1.Be of the minimum required age a. (typically, at least 18)
- 2. Continuously and physically live in the United States as a green card holder for a certain number of years
- 3. Establish residency in the state or U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) district where they intend to apply
- 4. Have "good moral character"
- 5.Be proficient in basic spoken and written English and demonstrate knowledge of U.S. history and government
- 6.Register for military service (if a male of a certain age) and be willing to perform civil service when required
- 7. Swear allegiance to the United States

Naturalization Oath of Allegiance to the United States of America - 2023

SINCE THE FIRST NATURALIZATION LAW IN 1790, APPLICANTS FOR NATURALIZATION HAVE TAKEN AN OATH TO SUPPORT THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES.

- 1.I hereby declare, on oath, that I absolutely and entirely renounce and abjure all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, of whom or which I have heretofore been a subject or citizen;
- 2.that I will support and defend the Constitution and laws of the United States of America against all enemies, foreign and domestic;
- 3.that I will bear true faith and allegiance to the same;
- 4.that I will bear arms on behalf of the United States when required by the law;
- 5.that I will perform noncombatant service in the Armed Forces of the United States when required by the law;
- 6.that I will perform work of national importance under civilian direction when required by the law;
- 7. and that I take this obligation freely, without any mental reservation or purpose of evasion;
- 8. so help me God."
