

14 So then, dear friends, since you are looking forward to this, make every effort to be found spotless, blameless and at peace with him.


15 Bear in mind that our Lord's patience means salvation, just as our dear brother Paul also wrote you with the wisdom that God gave him.

Does grace mean the blessing I say before I eat??

Grace is a short prayer said before or after eating, yes, but it is so much more than praying a thankful prayer to Jesus for our food.

Grace is the basis for our Christian faith. In the NKJV Bible, the word grace is mentioned **171 times**. We believe we are saved by faith through grace. God's grace is usually explained as kindness and forgiveness that we do not deserve. Grace cannot be earned; it is something that is freely given by God.

God built us a bridge to Jesus with grace. With the grace bridge we can freely access our Savior. Grace allows us to have a special relationship with Jesus in spite of our sin. Grace allows us free access to Jesus, even though we don't deserve it. Praise!



God's grace is a free gift.

Free means what? Do we have to pay? Do we have to do something? **Nope.**Free means free. It is a gift that is given for no reason other than love.
God told us that He is love. Love originates from God alone.

Grace is a free gift, we don't deserve and it comes from a God who is full of love for us.

Grace is often described with terms like "undeserved" or "unmerited favor." What does unmerited mean? It means not deserved or earned. If you score a goal in hockey or shoot a basketball and earn a point then you have *merited* your team with a point right?

Is scoring a point grace or earned reward?

Jesus doesn't count peoples' successes and failures to decide who receives his grace. Instead, because of the kindness and intention of His will, God gives all His grace and love freely, and in the Bible, He describes himself as **gracious**.

Will someone please read Exodus 34:5-9





How does Jesus define grace?

Grace refers to God's favor to everyone.

We have all sinned against God from the moment we are born. We cannot escape from sin no matter how hard we try.

Why? Because of the curse of Adam and Eve, who disobeyed the one rule that Jesus told them not do do. Don't eat from one tree.

Humanity did not have the capacity to defeat the cunning sinful power of Satan. Satan was described by Jesus as a murderer and deceiver from the beginning:

John 8:44

... He was a murderer from the beginning, and does not stand in the truth, because there is no truth in him. When he speaks a lie, he speaks from his own resources, for he is a liar and the father of it.

So since the beginning of humanity, we have all sinned against God's law. Grace was needed from God since the beginning. The whole Bible cries out the need of Jesus and His wonderful Grace from Genesis to Revelation.

> We have always needed a Savior who would defeat death and sin for eternity.



And the Child grew and became strong in spirit, filled with wisdom; and the grace of God was upon Him.



What does it mean to Walk In Grace?

2 Corinthians 12:9 - Who wrote the book of Corinthians?

And He said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for My strength is made perfect in weakness." Therefore most gladly I will rather boast in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me.

"Walk In Grace" is not some fancy thing to say or hear at church, it's a special invitation from Jesus. To walk in grace means to give your hurt and pain to Jesus and He will give us the grace that **we don't deserve** to get through it.

God's grace allows us to do **crazy stuff** like celebrate in our pain. For example:

Mr. Dustin broke his arm really bad and had to have a very complicated surgery to repair it. Do you know what his reaction was? He said that he was thankful for the experience because He was able to witness to the doctors and nurses! Is that and example of grace? Do you think Mr. Dustin was reacting from his own thoughts and feelings or were his actions a gift from the Holy Spirit?

Do you have a personal experience of God's grace in your life?

Walking implies action! It is a response and a movement.



Ephesians 2:8-9

For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God, not of works, lest anyone should boast.



Giving grace to another person is thinking of them the way Jesus thinks of them, unconditionally, just as God forgave us through Christ.

"Bear with each other and forgive whatever grievances you may have against one another. Forgive as the Lord forgave you" Colossians 3:13,



Acts 16:25-34

About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the other prisoners were listening to them. Suddenly there was such a violent earthquake that the foundations of the prison were shaken. At once all the prison doors flew open, and everyone's chains came loose. The jailer woke up, and when he saw the prison doors open, he drew his sword and was about to kill himself because he thought the prisoners had escaped. But Paul shouted, "Don't harm yourself! We are all here!"

The jailer called for lights, rushed in and fell trembling before Paul and Silas. He then brought them out and asked, "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?"

They replied, "Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved—you and your household." Then they spoke the word of the Lord to him and to all the others in his house. At that hour of the night the jailer took them and washed their wounds; then immediately he and all his household were baptized. The jailer brought them into his house and set a meal before them; he was filled with joy because he had come to believe in God—he and his whole household.



Is grace same as forgiveness?

While forgiveness is reactive, meaning it's something you do after you have been hurt and wronged, Grace is proactive, meaning it is a Godly state of being or a Christ-like way of life.

Grace is active when painful and wrong things happen, and grace prevents you from experiencing worldly reactions like returning the hate and hurt.

The Holy Spirit allows grace to occur when you are able to overwhelm and destroy the pain and hurt with a Godly covering. That grace covering **does**not allow you to experience the world like you used to. We are made new in Jesus because we have the Holy Spirit as our Helper.



God's miracle of **grace** is something we must ask for. Let's ask Jesus for that now.

Please Jesus, if it be your will, please allow me to have the gift of grace so that I might be a good example of you in my life. When bad things happen to me, please let me be gracious like you command. Please let me shine in YOUR LIGHT, not my own, and let me be more like you every day.

In Jesus' name, amen.







What are the 5 characteristics of grace?



GRACE IS ALSO AN ACRONYM REPRESENTING FIVE ATTRIBUTES:

is for generosity, the Godly will to do something kind, that is not deserved.

is response, grace is a covering or gift that comes from God, it is not of ourselves.

is action, the Godly reaction of not returning hurt for hurt

is compassion, the concern for others that comes from a heart like Jesus.

is energy to give Grace, the gift of the Holy Spirit.

Dear Lord, when these things happen to me, can I please remember to apply your grace covering first? Can I please remember to just say "help" and know that You will be there with me and give me the grace to know how You would handle these things?

- 25 When the disciples heard this, they were greatly astonished and asked, "Who then can be saved?"
- 26 Jesus looked at them and said, "With man this is impossible, but with God all things are possible."
- 27 Peter answered him, "We have left everything to follow you! What then will there be for us?"
- 28 Jesus said to them, "Truly I tell you, at the renewal of all things, when the Son of Man sits on his glorious throne, you who have followed me will also sit on twelve thrones, judging the twelve tribes of Israel.
- 29 And everyone who has left houses or brothers or sisters or father or mother or wife or children or fields for my sake will receive a hundred times as much and will inherit eternal life.
- 30 But many who are first will be last, and many who are last will be first.
