

with luck.


Or a pot of gold,

WHO WAS ST. PATRICK?

St. Patrick lived a very long time ago, around the beginning of the 3rd century (200-300 AD)

St. Patrick was kidnapped from his home in Roman Britain at the age of 16, and was sold into slavery in Ireland.

How Do We Share the Gospel?


The Bible tells us very simply how we can be saved. Romans 10:8-11, tells us that the way of faith is this:




“The word is near you; it is in your mouth and in your heart,” that is, the message concerning faith that we proclaim:
