




The Amazing and Interesting Life of John the Apostle.

John the Apostle, also known as John the Beloved, was likely born around 6 AD. He was born in Bethsaida, Galilee, Roman Empire. His parents were Zebedee and Salome, and he was the brother of **James**, another of Jesus' apostles.

AD 85-90 is an accepted time for the writing of the Gospel of John.

Purpose of Writing: "But these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing you may have life in His name (John 20:31)

John emphasized Jesus Christ as "the Son of God," fully God and fully man.

A false doctrine was circulating at that time which taught the "Christ-spirit" came upon the human Jesus at His baptism and left Him at the crucifixion.

And I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish; neither shall anyone snatch them out of My hand" (John 10:28).

"Jesus said to him, 'Have I been with you so long, and yet you have not known Me, Philip? He who has seen Me has seen the Father; so how can you say, "Show us the Father"?(John 14:9).

Some of miracles and historical accounts, such as the raising of Lazarus, are found only in John.


The Gospel of John often gives the reason behind events mentioned in the other gospels.



How many books of the Bible were written by John? the Gospel of John, three letters (1, 2, and 3 John), and the Book of Revelation.

John listed as the youngest apostle, he was the son of Zebedee and Salome.

His brother James was another of the Twelve Apostles.

John is named as the beloved disciple, as well as the one whom Jesus loved, in the New Testament of the Bible. John was one of the first to follow Jesus, was seated next to Jesus at the Last Supper, and was the only disciple present at the crucifixion of Jesus.

James and John were known for their fiery temper and were given the nickname "Sons of Thunder" by Jesus

The Bible doesn't record his death. There's a tradition that he lived a very long life, and that Jesus granted him a wish to remain in the flesh until Christ's return, which he would be able to witness.

Early Christian writers like Tertullian in the 2nd century say John was thrown into boiling oil but was unharmed.

John was exiled to Patmos where he received the book of Revelation which tells what will happen in the future, this is the only book of the Bible that comes with the promise of a blessing for anyone who reads it.

After Jesus' death, Mary, his mother, continued to live and was cared for by the Apostle John, as Jesus had instructed at the cross






In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth.

Light, a fundamental aspect of our universe, is both a wave and a particle, exhibiting properties of both energy and matter. It travels at the fastest speed possible in a vacuum, 299,792,458 meters per second, and is responsible for our ability to see, as well as many natural phenomena like rainbows and photosynthesis.






Now the earth was formless and empty, darkness was over the surface of the deep, and the Spirit of God was hovering over the waters.

Light comes from various sources, both natural and artificial. The sun is the primary natural source of light for Earth, providing the energy for life. Other natural sources include stars, lightning, and bioluminescence. Artificial sources of light include light bulbs, lasers, and fire

And God said, "Let there be light," and there was light. God saw that the light was good, and he separated the light from the darkness.

Electrons don't really "come from" a specific place in the way we often think of things appearing. Instead, they are fundamental particles that are already present in all atoms, and they can be moved around. In the context of electricity, electrons are already present in the wires and components of a circuit. When a voltage is applied, these electrons are simply moved, creating an electrical current.







The resurrected Jesus had scars from the crucifixion wounds, demonstrating that it was the same physical body



John the Baptist Denies Being the Messiah

- 19 Now this was John's testimony when the Jewish leaders in Jerusalem sent priests and Levites to ask him who he was.
- 20 He did not fail to confess, but confessed freely, I am not the Messiah."
- 21 They asked him, "Then who are you? Are you Elijah?" He said, "I am not." "Are you the Prophet?" He answered, "No."
- 22 Finally they said, "Who are you? Give us an answer to take back to those who sent us. What do you say about yourself?"
- 23 John replied in the words of Isaiah the prophet, "I am the voice of one calling in the wilderness, 'Make straight the way for the Lord.'"








24 Now the Pharisees who had been sent




John, as in John the Baptist, was related to Jesus as his cousin.

29 The next day John saw Jesus coming toward him and said, "Look, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!

30 This is the one I meant when I said, 'A man who comes after me has surpassed me because he was before me.'

31 I myself did not know him, but the reason I came baptizing with water was that he might be revealed to Israel."

32 Then John gave this testimony: "I saw the Spirit come down from heaven as a dove and remain on him.

33 And I myself did not know him, but the one who sent me to baptize with water told me, 'The man on whom you see the Spirit come down and remain is the one who will baptize with the Holy Spirit.'



















John's Disciples Follow Jesus

So they went and saw where he was staying, and they spent that day with him. It was about four in the afternoon.

40 Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, was one of the two who heard what John had said and who had followed Jesus.



This was similar to how God had changed names in the Old Testament, signifying a spiritual transformation and a new role within God's plan


In the Bible, God's names are important because they reveal aspects of His character, power, and purpose, and they are essential for building a relationship with Him.

Understanding these names helps believers grasp who God is and how He relates to them

Yahweh, Elohim, or Jehovah-Rohi - a Hebrew name for God that translates to "The Lord is my shepherd" offer a unique insight into His attributes and personality.

Yahweh - the most sacred name of God in Judaism, often translated as "I AM, or I AM who I AM", or "He causes to exist". God's name reveals his eternal and self-existent nature.

Elohim (meaning "God") highlights His power and sovereignty.






Why does it hurt my feelings when someone "calls me a name"?

"Calling names" refers to using mean, insulting, or bad language towards someone. It's a form of verbal abuse, often used to belittle or humiliate another person.

In most cases, people do this to make themselves feel bigger, or better than the person they are trying to insult or make feel

This signifies Jesus' authority over all creation, and the name is linked to this authority and power.







Jesus Calls Philip and Nathanael

Philip the Apostle, one of Jesus' twelve disciples, was a fisherman from Bethsaida, according to the Bible. He worked alongside Andrew and Peter.

Later, after becoming a disciple, he is also known for his evangelistic work as one of the seven deacons in the early church, preaching and performing miracles in Samaria and baptizing an Ethiopian eunuch






Acts 8, the Spirit of the Lord miraculously transported Philip, from meeting an Ethiopian eunuch to the city of Azotus (Ashdod).

This relocation is described as the Spirit "carrying Philip away" after the eunuch's baptism.

The distance between

is approximately

20 miles!





47 When Jesus saw Nathanael approaching, he said of him, "Here truly is an Israelite in whom there is no deceit."

This ladder symbolizes a connection between heaven and earth, and the vision signifies God's covenant with Jacob, establishing a means of communication between the two.


God is also present above the ladder, speaking to Jacob.

Nathanael was from Cana in Galilee.

Cana, is a town in Galilee, Israel, known in the New Testament as the location where Jesus performed his first miracle: turning water into wine at a wedding feast. It is also mentioned as the hometown of the disciple Nathanael (John 21:2)

Nathanael was a close friend of Philip, who introduced him to Jesus.

Nathanael was probably a farmer?


- The Galilee region was known for its agricultural, so people from Cana were likely farmers, working in vineyards and olive groves.
- Ancient Israel, including Cana, had a thriving wine industry, and wine was a staple of the diet and a significant part of the culture and economy.
- The local economy likely involved other agricultural products, such as wheat, barley, figs, pomegranates, and dates.

Jesus Changes Water Into Wine


1 On the third day a wedding took place at Cana in Galilee. Jesus' mother was there,

2 and Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding.

3 When the wine was gone, Jesus' mother said to him, "They have no more wine."

4 "Woman, why do you involve me?" Jesus replied. "My hour has not yet come."

5 His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you."



7 Jesus said to the servants, "Fill the jars with water"; so they filled them to the brim.

8 Then he told them, "Now draw some out and take it to the master of the banquet."

Miracle - an extraordinary event, surpassing natural or human capabilities, by divine power, a sign of God's presence and purpose

They did so,

9 and the master of the banquet tasted the water that had been turned into wine. He did not realize where it had come from, though the servants who had drawn the water knew. Then he called the bridegroom aside

10 and said, "Everyone brings out the choice wine first and then the cheaper wine after the guests have had too much to drink; but you have saved the best till now."

11 What Jesus did here in Cana of Galilee was the first of the signs through which he revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him.

12 After this he went down to Capernaum with his mother and brothers and his disciples. There they stayed for a few days.

16 To those who sold doves he said, "Get these out of here! Stop turning my Father's house into a market!"

17 His disciples remembered that it is written: "Zeal for your house will consume me."

18 The Jews then responded to him, "What sign can you show us to prove your authority to do all this?"

In the Bible, Passover commemorates the Exodus of the Israelites from slavery in Egypt, with the "passing over" of the death angel sparing their firstborn, and is observed for seven days



Jerusalem was expected to be heavily populated with pilgrims during Passover, the time when Jesus is said to have overturned the tables in the temple, with estimates suggesting a significant increase in the city's population.

During Passover, money changers exchanged foreign coins for Jewish currency, often at very high rates rates, and also sold sacrificial animals for too much money.

Why do you think that this make Jesus upset?

Doves were sold to poor people who could not afford more expensive sacrifices for Passover. Do you think they were selling the doves fairly or unfairly. What would be an example of this in your current church?





19 Jesus answered them, "Destroy this temple, and I will raise it again in three days."

20 They replied, "It has taken forty-six years to build this temple, and you are going to raise it in three days?"

21 But the temple he had spoken of was his body.

22 After he was raised from the dead, his disciples recalled what he had said. Then they believed the scripture and the words that Jesus had spoken.

23 Now while he was in Jerusalem at the Passover Festival, many people saw the signs he was performing and believed in his name.

24 But Jesus would not entrust himself to them, for he knew all people.

25 He did not need any testimony about mankind, for he knew what was in each person.



- 3 Now there was a Pharisee, a man named Nicodemus who was a member of the Jewish ruling council.
- 2 He came to Jesus at night and said, "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God. For no one could perform the signs you are doing if God were not with him."
- 3 Jesus replied, "Very truly I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God unless they are born again."
- 4 "How can someone be born when they are old?" Nicodemus asked. "Surely they cannot enter a second time into their mother's womb to be born!"




While "religion" and "faith" are words that are used as the same meaning, they represent different concepts.


Faith is a personal belief or trust in God.


"Born again" signifies a spiritual transformation where a person experiences a new life in Christ, becoming a child of God through faith in Jesus.



Repentance involves humbly seeking forgiveness from God, turning away from sin, and striving to live a more righteous life.

In Jesus' day, Jewish weddings involved a multi-stage process, including betrothal (a legally binding agreement), a waiting period, and a wedding ceremony and feast. The betrothal, or "erusin," was a formal commitment, while the actual wedding ceremony involved a procession, blessings, and a shared cup of wine, followed by a multi-day feast

Betrothal (Erusin):

Formal Agreement: The betrothal was a legally binding agreement between the groom's and bride's families, often arranged by the fathers.

Ketubah: A ketubah, or marriage contract, was drawn up, outlining the groom's obligations to his wife.

Dowry: The groom typically provided a dowry to the bride's family.

Shared Cup of Wine: The couple would share a cup of wine, symbolizing their commitment.

Waiting Period: A period of about a year followed, during which the bride prepared her wedding garments and the groom prepared their future home.

During the erusin period, the groom was to prepare a place for his bride, while the bride focused on her personal preparations: wedding garments, lamps, etc.

Although the bride knew to expect her groom after about a year, she did not know the exact day or hour. He could come earlier. It was the father of the groom who gave final approval for him to return to collect his bride.

For that reason, the bride kept her oil lamps ready at all times, just in case the groom came in the night, sounding the shofar (ram's horn) to lead the bridal procession to the home he had prepared for her.

Read Matthew 25:1-13

In Jewish weddings today, there are two cups of wine during the wedding ceremony. After the rabbi recites the betrothal blessings accompanying the first, the couple drinks from the cup. Since wine is associated with Kiddish, the prayer of sanctification recited on Shabbat (*This is the Hebrew word for the Sabbath, the Jewish day of rest observed from Friday evening to Saturday evening. It's a time for rest, prayer, and family.*)

In the season of Yeshua's end-time return, we should be careful to remain alert and prepared for His coming, since Yeshua was speaking to His disciples prophetically about the condition of the Church in the last days.

"Not everyone who says to Me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but only he who does the will of my Father who is in heaven." (Matthew 7: 21)

The Wedding Ceremony:

Procession: The groom, accompanied by his friends, would go to the bride's home at night, often with torches or lamps.

Blessings: The couple would receive blessings, sometimes drawing from scripture.

Shared Cup of Wine: Another shared cup of wine marked the consummation of the marriage.

Chuppah: The ceremony often took place under a chuppah, a canopy symbolizing their new home.
