St Patrick's Day

Instructions: Read the following passage and answer the four questions on the following page.

St. Patrick's Day is celebrated on March 17th every year. It is named after Saint Patrick, the patron saint of Ireland, who is believed to have died on this date in the year 461. The holiday has a long and complex history, and its modern celebration has evolved over time.



Saint Patrick was born in Roman Britain in the late 4th century. At the age of 16, he was kidnapped by Irish raiders and brought to Ireland as a slave. After six years of captivity, he escaped and returned to Britain, where he became a priest. He later returned to Ireland as a missionary and used the three leaf clover to explain the Holy Trinity. He is credited with converting many of the country's pagan inhabitants to Christianity.

The first St. Patrick's Day parade was not held in Ireland, but in New York City in 1762. The parade was organised by Irish soldiers who were serving in the British army. Today, New York City hosts the largest St. Patrick's Day parade in the world, with over 2 million people lining the streets to watch the festivities.

The traditional color associated with St. Patrick's Day is green, which is said to represent Ireland's lush landscape. The holiday is also associated with symbols such as the shamrock, and the leprechaun, a mischievous mythical creature from Irish folklore.



St Patrick's Day

A patron saint is a Christian saint believed to offer special protection and intercession to a specific person, place, activity, or group, and is often chosen or assigned through tradition or personal preference.

A pagan, is someone who practices a polytheistic or nature-worshipping religion, or who is not a follower of Judaism, Islam, or Christianity. The term "pagan" originally referred to people in the Roman Empire who practiced religions other than Christianity, often those who worshipped multiple gods or nature spirits.

The Pagan Evolution of St. Patrick's Day Celebrations:

While St. Patrick's Day was originally a religious holiday in Ireland, as Irish immigrants introduced their traditions to other countries, it transformed into a broader celebration of Irish heritage, and leprechauns became a key symbol of that celebration. In Irish folklore, leprechauns are described as small, mischievous creatures who guard pots of gold at the end of rainbows. Today, leprechauns are one of the most recognizable icons of St. Patrick's Day, appearing in parades, decorations, and other festivities.



St Patrick's Day is celebrated world wide on the 17th of March. It honours St Patrick, a Roman British bishop, who spread Christianity throughout Ireland in the early fifth century.

As a teenager, St Patrick was kidnapped by pirates, taken to Ireland and was held as a slave for six years before he escaped back to Britain. He trained to become a priest then moved back to Ireland to be a missionary, setting up churches and schools.
